The Territory is home to some breath-taking coastal areas which support important habitat for marine animals and shorebirds, provide recreation space for residents and visitors, and hold significant cultural heritage values.

Coastal areas provide a great opportunity for participating in activities that enhance community engagement and support conservation purposes, such as beach clean ups, collecting ghost nets, recording birds, tagging turtles and dune rehabilitation.

This symposium will showcase some of the incredible species that call NT coastal areas home, including endangered and migratory species, and the importance of protecting their habitat. It will highlight some of the fantastic activities that are being undertaken in NT coastal areas by Indigenous ranger groups, volunteers, researchers, not for profit organisations and Government, and provide inspiration and information for anyone wanting to become involved.
